NGAT LIFE MEMBER #2 EDWARD M. YTURRI SERVED ON GENERAL MACARTHUR'S STAFF

Edward M. Yturri never knew as a young boy growing up in Texas that he'd one day be part of a legendary United States general's staff, but that's just what happened to him after being drafted into the U.S. Army toward the tail end of World War II.

After basic training, Yturri began studying the Japanese language. After he completed those classes, the Army sent him to Japan, where he served as a counter-intelligence member of General Douglas MacArthur's staff. This was during the period MacArthur was heading up the post-war rebuilding of Japan, but there were still many challenges to the U.S. military. Yturri served 39 months in Japan.

Following this stint, Yturri stayed in the Army for eight years. After leaving active duty, Yturri continued his military service in the Texas National Guard. He entered the Army as a private, but would eventually work his way into the officer ranks before retiring after 30 years of active and National Guard service as a Colonel.

COL (Ret) Edward M. Yturri became a life member of NGAT on Mar 1, 1959 and was issued Life Membership #2. Today Yturri is 96 years old and still enjoys life and visiting with family and friends. Thank you for your service COL Yturri. ★



annual Lincoln Marathon, May 7, 2023, in Lincoln, Nebraska. The Texas Army National Guard was represented by MAJ Amanda Tooke, CPT Melinda Dominguez, **CPT Ethan McIntosh, 1LT Sarah** Perez, SSG Alicia Reagan, and SPC Zakary Widenor.

CPT Melinda Dominguez, Joint Forces Headquarters, Austin, Texas, placed 2nd in her age group and earned a spot on the All-Guard Marathon Team after completing the 26.2 miles in 3:44:16. CPT Ethan McIntosh, Recruiting and Retention



Command, Houston, Texas, placed 10th in his age group and earned a spot on the All-Guard Marathon Team after completing the 26.2 miles in 2:58:35.

More than 200 Airmen and Soldiers representing the National Guard from all 50 states, three U.S. territories, and the District of Columbia ran the Lincoln Marathon. This is the first time in over three decades that "all 54" were represented in the field of National Guard competitors for the marathon.

The runners on the All-Guard Marathon Team will travel to other races over the next two years throughout the United States. The National Guard Military Competitions Program, which includes both a Marathon Team and an Endurance Team, exists to promote physical fitness, self-discipline, and esprit de corps among National Guard members while assisting recruiting and retention efforts at each community where they compete. *

88th Texas Legislature: Veteran Related Bills



The 88th Texas Legislature, Regular Session, convened on January 10, 2023, and adjourned May 29, 2023. Below are some of the Veteran-related bills that passed that NGAT has supported. Most have an effective date of September 1, 2023, unless otherwise noted. For a complete review of all bills and further details concerning those bills listed below go to https://legiscan.com/TX/bill.

HB 90 – REP JARED PATTERSON – SURVIVOR BENEFITS: This bill was named after Texas Army National Guardsmen Sergeant Bishop Evans, who drowned in the Rio Grande River while on state active duty attempting to rescue individuals who were attempting to swim across the river. The bill allows compensation for certain survivors of members of the Texas Military Forces.

HB 282 — REP VALOREE SWANSON — SPECIALTY LICENSE PLATES: Texas Department of Motor Vehicles will issue specialty license plates for recipients of the Texas Homeland Defense Service Medal, Texas Superior Service Medal, Lone Star Distinguished Service Medal, Texas Outstanding Service Medal, and Texas Medal of Merit.

HB 621 — REP. MATTHEW SHAHEEN — SPECIALTY LICENSE PLATES: Texas Department of Motor Vehicles will issue specialty license plates for recipients of the Commendation Medal or Commendation Medal with Valor for each branch of the military and for joint.

HB 671 — REP MARK GONZALEZ — SUICIDE PREVENTION: Texas Veterans Commission shall conduct a suicide prevention campaign to provide veterans with information regarding suicide prevention by establishing a dedicated Internet website to provide veterans with information regarding suicide prevention and collaborate with community-based, nonprofit, or private organizations to conduct the suicide prevention campaign.

HB 1633 — **REP LINA ORTEGA** — **DISABLED PLACARD FINES:** Additional fines have been added for violations in regards to disabled parking placards.

HB 1740 — REP JEFF LEACH — WAIVER OF STATE PARK FEE: Waiver of certain state park fees for resident of Texas who are 65 years old or over who has resided in the state for six consecutive month preceding the date of the application, honorably discharged veterans of the United States Armed Forces, a member of the United States armed services on active duty, surviving spouse, parent, child, or sibling of a person who died while serving in the United States Armed Forces.

HB 2503 — REP JOHN LUJAN — SPECIALTY LICENSE PLATES: Texas Department of Motor Vehicles will issue specialty license plates for recipients of the Texas Humanitarian Service Medal.

HB 2892 — REP BRAD BUCKLEY — TRANSFER OF STUDENTS: Transfer of students to other school districts who are children of servicemembers, which means an active duty member of the armed forces of the United States, a reserve component of the armed forces of the United States, or the Texas National Guard.

HB 5142 — REP KYLE KACAL — TX VETERANS DRIVER'S LICENSE: To obtain a specially marked veterans driver's license the Texas Department of Motor Vehicles must accept a veteran ID card issued by the United States Department of Veterans Affair of a ID card issued by the United States Department of Defense as sufficient proof of the veteran's military service and honorable discharge.

SB 423 — SENATOR ANGELA PAXTON — UNMANNED AIRCRAFTS: Effective immediately this bill add verbiage that makes it lawful to capture an image using an unmanned aircraft in the State of Texas as part of an operation, exercise, or mission of the Texas Military Forces.





TEXAS ARMY GUARD TEAM WINS MARKSMANSHIP CONTEST

FOUR TEXAS ARMY NATIONAL GUARD MEMBERS won the 52nd Annual Winston P. Wilson Championship in Little Rock, Arkansas, April 29-May 5, 2023.

The National Guard annually hosts the competition to promote marksmanship training. Guard members test their marksmanship skills and weapon systems in a battle-focused environment.

"Marksmanship is the quintessential skill of a Soldier," said COL Kevin Crawford, 176th Engineer Brigade Commander. "Having Soldiers of this caliber are a force multiplier to having trained, mission-ready forces. The outcome was fantastic, allowing their world-class performance to take the competition."

This year's competition featured 57 fourperson teams representing 43 states and territories.

The Texas Army National Guard team, known as the Texas Alpha Team, included **SFC Charles Stevener and SFC Stephen Duron**, both from 1st Battalion, 143rd Infantry Regiment; **1LT Samuel Slichter** of the 386th Engineer Battalion, and CPT Ross Buntyn of the 111th Engineer Battalion. During the event CPT Buntyn served as team captain.

Team awards won by Texas Alpha Team included High Overall Team Aggregate and High Overall Rifle Team Aggregate. Individual awards included 1st Place Overall Novice, 1st Place Rifle Novice, 3rd Place Rifle Novice, and 3rd Place Pistol Novice.

Established by Maj Gen Winston P. Wilson, then chief of the National Guard Bureau, the first rifle and pistol championships took place at Camp Robinson in 1971.

In 2007, the competition was revamped to focus on combat survivability and the capability of service members to employ their service weapons effectively. While basic marksmanship is still integral to the competition, combat realism, physical exertion and close individual and team coordination of the participants are now emphasized.

This year, the Texas Alpha Team competed day and night against other teams in 29 marksmanship challenges, using their M4A1 carbine and M17 service weapons. Challenges included individual and team events ranging from close-quarter battle scenarios to longdistance marksmanship. Teams navigated strong winds, harsh sunlight, exhaustion, and various shooting formats.

Legal Update with Trinh Warner **Divorce and the Military**

AS A RETIREE OF THE U.S. AIR FORCE and having gone through divorce (twice!) as an active-duty member, there is a lot of "legal stuff" to impart in this article. However, there are much more important considerations that have nothing to do with the law and by being concerned about these non-legal issues, military members going through divorce will act in their own best interests regarding divorce.

Children. It is not their fault parents are divorcing and they ought never to feel they have any control over parents' behaviors. They need help to process divorce and the best help comes from therapists who deal specifically with children in divorce. This writer believes many of the ills of current society can be directly attributed to adults who were children of divorce. It is important to focus on the children and do what is best for THEM in divorce, and not what might be best for the parents. Family Court cares about the children before they care about the parents. Parents who act in their children's best interests will find their own best interests are also covered.

Child support. Parents who do not think of the children's futures regarding child support are generally not acting in the children's best interests. If not used immediately to care for the children, put the money in a 529 account for the children's college education or place it in a savings account, long-term CD, etc. for the children's future needs. Teenagers are expensive and children of divorce should be able to go to college, buy the prom dress, rent

the tux, take a date to dinner, etc. Child support is for the CHILDREN's best interest.

Marital Property. In the State of Texas, the default position is all property acquired after the marriage date is marital property and all property acquired before marriage is separate property, subject to liabilities that may exist with the property. There are some exceptions (inheritance, pre- and post-nuptial agreements, fault in divorce, etc.), but generally, the court will liquidate and divide the property in half, after the liabilities are paid. It behooves the marital couple to work out who may keep what property because in most cases, liquidation of marital properties in retirement accounts, pensions, and/or real property, etc. may be more expensive to the marital estate. Don't "cut off your nose to spite your face," cooperation will save both married people in attorney fees; in tax liability; in preserving property; etc.

WHEN PEOPLE THINK OF SOCIAL MEDIA INFLUENCERS with over 280,000 followers they don't normally think of National Guardsmen. Texas Army National Guard Chief Warrant Officer 2 Eugene Hunyadi is a targeting officer for the 56th Infantry Brigade Combat Team and 36th Infantry Division. But he is also a local celebrity within the unit and across the force, for making viral videos about his service in the Texas Military Department and the military. Before he started making videos, he had a blog where he talked about everything fitness related as well as his weight loss journey of losing 130 pounds to rejoin the military.

In the past few years, the military has updated guidance on the use of social media for service members. The updated guidance can be found in ALARACT 073/2022. "I've been asked by several Soldiers 'what would happen if I was told by the brigade commander or somebody else that I can't post videos on one of my pages anymore?" And my answer to them is, you know, I wouldn't make videos on that platform anymore," Hunyadi said. "I'm always going to follow the rules, regulations and directives that we're given, and I do think that the military should make sure that what we're doing is safe and right."

"It's like when you hand a private a rifle, it's a dangerous weapon if it's not handled properly," Hunyadi said. "If they don't have the right training, they can hurt themselves or hurt others. When you have the proper training, the proper guidance and you've been shown how to use that weapon properly, it is a tool that you can use to accomplish your commander's mission. I think that the same is true of social media if we receive good guidance, if we receive good information, it is possible that it can be a tool for positive gains in morale, in mentoring, coaching, in teaching and in showing that the military lifestyle, while not easy, is something that's fulfilling and rewarding." 




