

Maj Gen Ondra L. Berry served as The Adjutant General, for the State of Nevada. As Adjutant General, he was the senior uniformed Nevada National Guard officer responsible for formulating, developing and coordinating all policies, programs and plans affecting more than 4,400 Nevada Army and Air National Guard personnel. Appointed by the Governor, State of Nevada, General Berry served as the Governor's principal advisor on all National Guard issues, was responsible for both the federal and state missions of the

Nevada National Guard and served as the official channel of communication with the National Guard Bureau, Department of the Army, and Department of the Air Force. General Berry received his commission from the Air National Guard Academy of Military Science in 1990.

National Guard Bureau Senior Enlisted Advisor (SEA) John T. Raines III is the SEA to the Chief of the National Guard Bureau, stationed at the Pentagon, Washington DC. He serves as the Chief's principal military advisor on all enlisted matters affecting training, operations, health of the force, and enlisted professional development. As the highest enlisted leadership level, SEA Raines provides direction for the enlisted force and represents their interests.

SEA Raines is a native of Alabama and has been married to his wife, Karen, for 35 years.
